Dr. Angelos has a special interest in minimally invasive endocrine surgery, a type of surgery that is performed through small incisions. Minimally invasive surgery has many benefits for patients -- from less scarring and pain, to a shorter hospital stay and a quicker recovery.

An accomplished author, Dr. Angelos has published many journal articles and book chapters on his research into improving outcomes of <u>thyroid and parathyroid surgery</u>, minimally invasive endocrine surgery and best practices for <u>thyroid cancer</u> treatment.

Dr. Angelos is a recognized expert in medical ethics, and serves as associate director of the <u>University of Chicago MacLean Center for Clinical Medical Ethics</u>. He has written widely on ethical issues in surgical practice and how to best teach medical ethics to surgical residents.
